

How to Make Your Domain Name Point to Your New Website

After you've purchased a domain name, you'll need to connect it to your new website. This is done by setting the domain name to "point" to the Franklin Electric server that has your new website on it.

Here's what to do:

1. Sign into your Hover* account.
2. If you have more than one domain name listed in your account, click on the domain name that you want to use with customized DNS records. This will take you to its Domain Details page.



3. Click on the DNS tab to manage records for the selected domain name.
